1. 22:5-6 deal with someone whose **negligence** causes damage to another person's land. In verse 5, what causes damage to another's land?

2. There are several different case laws in 22:7-15, but what one basic issue are they all about?

3. What three acts are listed in chapter 22 that are so heinous that they're deserving of **death**?

4. In 22:21-27, what (at least four) groups of people are mentioned who are **vulnerable** and often marginalized?

5. In 22:29-30, list all the things that the people were to **give** or **offer** to the Lord.

6. 23:1-3 and 6-8 deal with **justice** in the **court** system. From these verses, write down at least five things that you were not to do – things that would lead to injustice.

7. In 23:10-11, the land was supposed to **rest** in the seventh year.
Why was it supposed to rest, according to the text?

In 23:12, the people were to rest every seventh day.
According to the text, why were they to rest?

8. What three feasts were the Israelites to celebrate each year?

According to the text, what time of year was each feast held?

9. Read 23:20-32 and answer the following questions about the conquest of **Canaan**:

In verse 22, the Lord said He'd be an enemy to Israel's **enemies**. What are several things that the Lord said in this text that He would do to their enemies?

What are the **blessings** that God promised to give Israel?

What were the Israelites to do to the **gods** of their enemies (v. 24)? What were they to do to the people of the land (vv. 30b-32)?

10. After the Lord was finished speaking to Moses, what two things did Moses tell the people (24:3)? What was the people's response?

What did Moses read to the people (v. 7)? What was their response?

11. Moses built an altar and offered sacrifices. Where did he sprinkle half of the **blood**? Where did he sprinkle the other half of the blood?

12. God called Moses up the mountain (24:1-2). For what purpose did He call him (v. 12)?

13. In verses 9-11, the leaders of Israel caught a glimpse of God. What did they see under His feet?

In verse 17, the people saw God's glory. What did it look like?
